Monthly Eucharistic Adoration – Day of Prayer for Vocations You and your family are invited to join the parish community the 4th Tuesday of every month any time between 9 a.m. (after 8:30 a.m. Mass) and 7 p.m. (before Mother of Perpetual Help Novena). Please come and spend a few minutes or an hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament and pray for vocations to the priesthood or religious life.

Special Year for Priests Pope Benedict XVI has declared June 19, 2009 through June 19, 2010 as the Year for Priests. The Holy Father has declared St. John Vianney the Universal Patron of All Priests on the occasion of the 150th Anniversary of the saint's

National Vocations Awareness Week (January) begins with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which marks Jesus' initiation into public ministry. From the universal call to holiness at Baptism, each one of us receives a special vocational calling from God. NVAW was celebrated January 10-16, 2010.

World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life (February) In 1997, John Paul II called for consecrated life to be promoted throughout the universal Church. All Things Girl - Truth for Teens by Teresa Tomeo, Molly Miller, Monica Cops, and Cheryl Dickow. Teenage girls are encouraged to learn and diligently live their Catholic faith with joy and integrity. This book tackles a variety of today's issues. There is a chapter entitled "Every Life is a Vocation". This book is filled with the teachings of the Catholic Church.

Be a Man!: Becoming the Man God Created You to Be by Fr. Larry Richards. Father Richard tells men how to live as a beloved son of God. This book challenges men to be strong, to appreciate properly the differences between men and women, to pursue holiness, and to make a difference in the world.
